INVITATION FOR BIDS FOR THE RESURFACING AND GUIDE RAIL REPLACEMENT FOR SLICKVILLE – SALTSBURG AND STORY ROADS FOR THE WESTMORELAND COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

Sealed bids will be received at the Office of the Westmoreland County Controller, 111 Courthouse Square, Greensburg, Pennsylvania until 2:00 P.M., prevailing time, Tuesday, July 7, 2020, and will be opened, checked, and read aloud approximately one-fourth hour later in the Commissioners' Conference Room, for the Resurfacing and Guide Rail Replacement for Slickville – Saltsburg and Story Roads for the Westmoreland County Department of Public Works.

Copies of the Bid Documents may be obtained at the Office of the Westmoreland County Department of Public Works, 194 Donohoe Road, Greensburg, Pennsylvania, 15601, between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. There will be a \$20.00 (\$25.00 if mailed) non-refundable fee charged for each set of Bid Documents.

A certified check or bidder's bond in the amount of ten (10%) of the total bid must be enclosed with the Bid Documents. Bid Bond of the lowest bidders will be held until the contract is awarded and the successful bidder supplies performance bond and signs contract. All other bid bonds will be returned within fifteen days after opening.

The Westmoreland County Commissioners reserve the right to reject any or all bids. The Commissioners also reserve the right to approve the sufficiency of any required surety.

Notice is also hereby given that this project is regulated under Executive Order 11246, the aims of which are to promote and insure equal opportunity for all persons, without regard to race, color, religion, sex or national origin, for employment or seeking of employment with government contractors. "Failure of a contractor or applicant to comply with any provision of the regulation shall be grounds for imposition of any or all the sanctions by the Order."

The minimum wage requirements as determined by the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry shall apply to this project.

PA DOT prequalification of bidders, including subcontractors for the proposed work is required on this project.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. General: Separate and sealed bids for **RESURFACING AND GUIDE RAIL REPLACEMENT FOR SLICKVILLE – SALTSBURG AND STORY ROADS** for Westmoreland County will be received at the Office of the County Controller, Courthouse Square, Suite 111, 2 North Main Street, Greensburg, Pennsylvania 15601 until 2:00 p.m. on **July 7, 2020**.

LATE BIDS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED OR CONSIDERED

Bids will be opened and read aloud on **July 7, 2020**, at approximately 2:15 P.M.

2. Submission of Bids: An original and one (1) copy of the complete Bid must be submitted in a sealed envelope, and addressed to the Westmoreland County Controller and clearly marked on the outside of the envelope with the Bidder's name and address and the designation:
 - a. **"BID – RESURFACING AND GUIDE RAIL REPLACEMENT FOR SLICKVILLE – SALTSBURG AND STORY ROADS"**
 - b. No responsibility will be attached to any COUNTY representative for premature opening of a bid not properly addressed and identified.
3. Bid Security: Each bid must be accompanied by a certified, good faith check drawn upon a bank authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, cashier's check, or by a bid bond with corporate surety, in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the amount bid for the total bid sum. Bid bonds must be signed by an authorized representative of both the bidder and the surety company, and accompanied by a power of attorney authorizing execution of the bond on behalf of the surety company, or the bid will be rejected.
4. Tax Exemptions: The County is exempt from all Federal excise and transportation taxes, the provisions of the Fair Trade law, and the Pennsylvania sales and use tax for purchase of tangible personal property. The registration number with the Internal Revenue Service is 25-6001046. No exemption certificates are required and none will be issued. Nothing in this paragraph is meant to exempt a construction contractor from the payment of sales tax or use tax required to be paid with respect to its purchase or use of tangible personal property used or transferred in connection with the performance of a construction contract. If the County is required by law to pay any excise tax and then seek a refund or credit, the contractor may add the amount of the tax to the bid price as a separate item.

The bidder will be required to complete an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form W-9. The form can be found on the IRS web site through this link:

<https://www.irs.gov/forms-pubs/about-form-w-9>. The form provides the bidder's taxpayer identification number and, if applicable, certification regarding backup withholding. Contractor will submit the completed (W-9) Form along with the executed contract.

5. Right to Accept or Reject Bids: The Westmoreland County Commissioners reserve the right to waive informalities for the best interest of the County, approve sufficiency of surety and reject any and all bids. Failure of the bidder to sign the bid or have the signature of an authorized agent or representative on the official bid form will be cause for rejection of the bid. Signature must be written in ink; typing or printing is not acceptable. Bidders must include all information required on the Official Bid Form. Failure to comply may be cause for rejection of the bid. Award of the contract will be made at the County's option to the lowest responsible bidder.
6. Approved Equal: Whenever a product is defined in this invitation by trade name and catalogue number of a manufacturer or vendor, the term "or approved equal," if not inserted therewith shall be implied. Any reference to a particular manufacturer's products either by trade name or by limited description is solely for the purpose of more clearly indicating the minimum standard of quality desired, except where a no substitution is requested, the County will consider bids for the referenced item only. The term "or approved equal" is defined as meaning any other make which, in the sole opinion of the County, is of such character, quality and performance equivalence as to meet the standard of quality of items specified for which it is to be used equally as well as that specified. The bidder quoting on a commodity other than as specified shall furnish complete identification on the bid proposal of the product he is offering by trade name brand and/or model number. The bidder shall also furnish descriptive literature and data with respect to the alternative commodity he proposes to furnish. Bidders offering an alternate shall also indicate any known specification deviations from the referenced item on a bid exception sheet.
7. Withdrawal of Bids: Bids may be withdrawn at any time prior to the designated time of the opening of bids. All bids must be firm for thirty (30) days following the bid opening, and no bids will be permitted to be withdrawn during such period. Bids will be awarded or rejected within thirty (30) days from opening. In the event award of Bid cannot be made within thirty (30) days from date of Bid Opening, bidders will be afforded the opportunity to extend their bid for an additional thirty (30) days by completing and submitting to the County a Consent to Extension of Date for Bid Award Form, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "A".
8. Provisions Required by Law Deemed Inserted: Each and every Provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in the Contract for this project will be deemed to be inserted therein and the Contract will be read and enforced as though it were included here, and if through mistake or otherwise any such

provision is not inserted, or is not correctly inserted, then upon the application of either party, the Contract shall forthwith be physically amended to make such insertion.

9. More Than One Bid: If more than one bid is offered by any one BIDDER, in his own name or in the name of his agent, partner, or other person, all bids submitted by such BIDDER shall be rejected.
10. Non-Discrimination Agreement: The Successful Bidder shall comply with the attached Non-Discrimination Agreement herein marked as Attachment "B".
11. Contractor Integrity: The Successful Bidder shall comply with the attached Contractor Integrity Agreement herein marked Attachment "C".
12. Addenda to Contract: During the bidding period the County may issue written Addenda to each person, firm or corporation which has secured a copy of these specifications, making changes or corrections to the specifications as issued. Such changes or corrections shall be included in the work and/or materials covered by the bid proposal, and such Addenda shall become part of the specifications and contract. Bidders who secure Bid Specifications via the internet are cautioned to verify if Addenda have been issued by the County prior to submission of bid. The County assumes no responsibility to notify any prospective bidder of Addenda to Bid Specifications that are secured via the internet.
13. Payment: The County will make monthly payments to the successful Bidder within thirty (30) days upon receipt an invoice for work completed. Five percent will be retained pending the project completion and final acceptance. At the completion of all work under the contract, the Engineer and contractor will compute the entire amount of each item of work performed and the contract value thereof. An inspection will be conducted and a "punch list" prepared noting all items not completed or not complying with the drawings and specifications. Upon completion of the "punch list" items and final acceptance of the work by the County, the successful bidder will receive the remaining payment along with the five percent retainage for the complete project. 14. Statement of Quantities - The tabulation of quantities is based upon the estimate of the Engineer of the nature, extent and quantities of the work contemplated. The estimated quantities are approximate only, and are given, only as an aid to the bidder in preparing its Total Bid Sum and are not represented to be accurate. Any inaccuracy or discrepancy therein shall not in any way subject the County to damages or relieve the successful bidder of its responsibility and liability in fulfilling the terms of the contract.

15. Time of Completion - The successful bidder will commence work after a "Written Notice to Proceed" has been given by the County and the successful bidder further covenants and agrees to begin work and perform same continuously and without interruptions to its completion during a sixty (60) calendar day time frame from the written notice to proceed, unless suspension thereof due to unsuitable weather or other conditions has been approved by the County Engineer. It is expressly understood and agreed that in case of the failure on the part of the successful bidder, for any reason, except as herein provided, to complete the furnishing and delivery of the materials and the doing and performance of said work within the aforesaid time period, the County shall deduct from any monies due or which may become due to the successful bidder, or if no monies shall be due, the County shall have the right to recover the amount of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars per day, as liquidated damages, for each and every calendar day elapsing between the time stipulated for the completion and the actual date of completion.

In the event that the work is delayed through no fault or neglect of the successful bidder, the County Commissioners, upon written request from the successful bidder, may make such extensions in the contract as the Commissioners deem just and reasonable.

16. Qualification of Bidders - The County Commissioners may make such investigations as they deem necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform the work, and upon request of the County the bidder shall furnish promptly such information and data as may be required or convenient for such purpose. PA DOT prequalification of bidders, including subcontractors for the proposed work is required on this project.

17. State Labor Provisions - The prevailing Pennsylvania Wage Requirements, as determined by the Pennsylvania Secretary of Labor and Industry, shall apply to this project. A copy of these requirements is enclosed.

19. The bidder shall list on a separate sheet of paper, when needed, any variations from, or exceptions to, the conditions and specifications of this bid. This sheet shall be labeled "Exception(s) to Bid Conditions and Specifications", and shall be attached to the bid.

20. In accordance to Pennsylvania's "Right to Know" Laws, (Act 3 of 2008: **65PS 67.101 et seq.**), the County may make available for viewing or provide copies of all bids received and all associated contract documents following awarding of same.

21. The submission of a Bid shall constitute and establish the Bidders intent to enter into a binding contract with Westmoreland County for the good and services solicited. Additionally, should any bid submitted contain defect(s) that in the County's opinion, is of a non-material nature, the Bidder agrees that by the submission of a Bid, Bidder will correct any defect(s) upon request of the County.
22. Unit Prices: In the event Unit Prices are required, the County reserves the right, should there be any discrepancy, inconsistency or difference between the Unit Price(s) and Total Price(s), to choose the lowest of the prices listed and the vendor shall be bound to provide the goods and/or services in question at the lowest cost. The County reserves the right to award for individual items, groups or combined award as may be in the County's best interest.
23. For all Public Works Projects in excess of \$25,000.00, the successful bidder shall be required to strictly follow and comply with all provisions of the Public Works Employment Verification **Act 43 PS § 167.1** and PA Code Regulations at **66.1 – 66.9**.

**SECTION IV
SPECIAL PROVISIONS**

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. CONTRACT BONDS - In accordance with the Pennsylvania Public Works Contractors' Bond Law of 1967, the successful bidder shall furnish to the County within ten days following the notification of the award of the contract, the following bonds on the forms prescribed which will become binding upon the and execution of the contract agreement.

- a. A Performance Bond at one hundred percent (100%) of the contract amount; conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract, in accordance with the plans, specifications, and conditions of the contract. Such bond shall be solely for the protection of the County.
- b. A Payment Bond at one hundred percent (100%) of the contract amount. Such bond shall be solely for the protection of individuals, firms, corporations, partnerships, and associations supplying labor or materials to the contractor or to any of its sub-contractors in the prosecution of the work provided for in the contract and shall be conditioned for the prompt payment of all such material furnished or labor supplied or performed in the prosecution of the work.

Each of such bonds shall be executed by a surety company legally authorized to do business in the Common-wealth of Pennsylvania.

2. MAINTENANCE BOND - The successful bidder shall agree for itself, its heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns to maintain all the work done under the contract in good condition for a period of two (2) years from the date of final acceptance of the same, the County being the judge of the condition of the work; and upon the acceptance of the completed work and before the surety which has furnished the Performance Bond is released, the contractor shall furnish a Maintenance Bond from an acceptable surety company in the full amount of the final cost to the County. Refer to Attachment D Maintenance Bond format.

3. INSURANCE - The successful bidder shall within ten days following the notification of the award of the contract, submit to the County certificates of insurance in accordance with the following requirements and subject to the approval and acceptance by the County.

- a. Compensation Insurance - The successful bidder shall take out and maintain during the life of the contract, Workmen's Compensation Insurance for all of its employees employed on this project, and in case any work is sublet, the successful bidder shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Workmen's compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees, unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the successful bidder.

- b. Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance - The successful bidder shall take out and maintain during the life of the contract, such Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance as shall protect it and any subcontractor performing work covered by the contract, from claims for personal injury, including accidental death, as well as claims for such operations whether by the successful bidder or by any subcontractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either, and the amounts of such insurance shall be as follows:
 - c. The successful bidder's Public Liability Insurance and Vehicle Liability Insurance shall be in an amount not less than \$500,000 for injuries, including accidental death, to any one person, and subject to the same limit for each person, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 on account of one accident, and contractor's Property Damage Insurance in an amount not less than \$500,000 each occurrence and \$1,000,000 aggregate.
4. CONSTRUCTION STAKES, LINES, AND GRADES - The Engineer shall furnish to the successful bidder only basic reference stakes and bench marks from which the successful bidder shall obtain all horizontal and vertical measurements required to lay out, establish and complete the proposed project in accordance with the approved plans. It shall be the obligation of the successful to stake out and thoroughly check all construction work.
5. INSPECTOR'S SHELTER - The successful bidder will not be required to provide an inspector's shelter.
6. MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC - The successful bidder shall cooperate with the adjacent property owners and conduct its work in such a manner as not to endanger or unnecessarily impede local traffic on the roadway. The successful bidder will maintain one lane of traffic on the roadway during the construction operations, and must exercise the utmost care to protect the traveling public at all times including flagman, signs, cones, barricades and other safety devices that may be necessary to maintain traffic, all in accordance with PA. DOT Publication 213.
7. PERMITS AND REGULATIONS - The successful bidder shall procure and pay all permits, license, and approvals necessary for the execution of its contract. The successful bidder shall comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, orders, and regulations relating to the performance of the work, the protection of adjacent properties, and the maintenance and protection of traffic.
8. SANITARY PROVISIONS - The successful bidder shall provide and maintain such sanitary accommodations for the use of its employees and those of its subcontractors as may be necessary to comply with the requirements and regulations of the local and State Department of Health. It shall be the duty of the successful bidder to see that these regulations are enforced. The successful bidder will be held responsible for damages due to the failure to observe sanitary

precautions.

9. SAFETY - The successful bidder shall conform to all national, state, and local safety laws and regulations.
10. CLEANING OF THE SITE - Before the work will be considered fully complete, the successful bidder shall clean and remove from the project and adjacent property all surplus and discarded materials, equipment, temporary structures, rubbish, and other waste matter and shall leave the project in a satisfactory and presentable condition throughout.
All work required to be done under this item shall be considered subsidiary to and included in the Total Bid Price and no extra compensation will be paid to the successful bidder for this item of work.
11. SUBCONTRACTORS - All subcontractors shall be considered as employees of the successful bidder. Westmoreland County will not recognize any subcontractors.
12. UTILITIES - It shall be the responsibility of the successful bidder to determine the locations of all existing utilities and comply with Pennsylvania Act 287 (April 9, 1975).
13. CHANGE ORDERS AND EXTRA WORK - All Change Orders must be approved in writing by the County Commissioners and the County Engineer. No payment will be allowed for extra work performed by the contractor unless so directed in writing by the County Commissioners and the County Engineer.
14. DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE – The contractor shall provide at least one (1) worker to answer emergency calls on a 24-hour basis and perform emergency service during non-working hours for any condition resulting from the Contractor's construction activities which represents a hazard to the project or to the public. This emergency contact must be available at any time of the day or night and any day of the week for this emergency work. This worker shall also be provided with a proper vehicle, supplies, and materials and be given sufficient authority to adequately perform this extended assignment. If the Contractor is notified of a deficiency and it is not corrected within two hours the Owner may initiate repairs and the Contractor will be back charged for this work.

SPECIFICATIONS

All items of work performed under this project shall be completed according to the latest Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Form 408 Specifications, unless otherwise specifically stated.

0413-0202 SUPERPAVE ASPHALT MIXTURE DESIGN, WEARING COURSE, PG 64S-22, < 0.3 MILLION ESALS, 9.5 MM MIX, SRL-H

This work shall be completed in accordance with the latest Penn DOT Publication 408. Specifications. Special interest shall be paid to the following sections:

1.a. – A Job-Mix Formula Report must be submitted and approved in accordance with this section.

1.b. – UNIFORMITY – Perform tests for bitumen content and aggregate gradation as established in the quality control plan in accordance with PTM NO. 1

1.c. – Acceptance of the Mixture (STANDARD) Certification to be submitted to the County following quality control tests for bitumen determination, sieve analysis, and superpave volumetric tests of the mixture.

7. Spreading and Finishing

ATTACHMENT B

NONDISCRIMINATION CLAUSE

During the term of this contract, the CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:

1) CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any employee, applicant for employment, independent contractor, or any other person because of race, color, religious creed, ancestry, national origin, age or sex. CONTRACTOR shall take affirmative action to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees or agents are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religious creed, ancestry, national origin, age or sex. Such affirmative action shall include, but is not limited to: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training. CONTRACTOR shall post in conspicuous places, available to all employees, agents, applicants for employment and other persons, a notice to be provided by the contracting agency setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

2) CONTRACTOR shall in advertisements or requests for employment placed by it or on its behalf state all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religious creed, ancestry, national origin, age or sex.

3) CONTRACTOR shall send each labor union or workers' representative with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice advising said labor union or workers' representative of its commitment to this nondiscrimination clause. Similar notice shall be sent to every other source of recruitment regularly utilized by CONTRACTOR.

4) It shall be no defense to a finding of noncompliance with the Contract Compliance Regulations issued by the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission or this nondiscrimination clause that CONTRACTOR had delegated some of its employment practices to any union, training program, or other source of recruitment which prevents it from meeting its obligations. However, if the evidence indicates that CONTRACTOR was not on notice of the third-party discrimination or made a good faith effort to correct it, such factor shall be considered in mitigation in determining appropriate sanctions.

5) Where the practices of a union or any training program or other source of recruitment will result in the exclusion of minority group persons, so that CONTRACTOR will be unable to meet its obligations under the Contract Compliance Regulations issued by the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission or this nondiscrimination clause, CONTRACTOR shall then employ and fill vacancies through other nondiscriminatory employment procedures.

6) CONTRACTOR shall comply with the Contract Compliance Regulations of the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission, 16 Pa. Code Chapter 49 and with all state and federal laws prohibiting discrimination in hiring or employment opportunities. In the event of CONTRACTOR's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clause of this contract, or with any such laws, this contract may, after hearing and adjudication, be terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, and CONTRACTOR may be declared temporarily ineligible for further County or Commonwealth contracts, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided by the Contract Compliance Regulations.

7) CONTRACTOR shall furnish all necessary employment documents and records to, and permit access to its books, records and accounts by, the contracting agency, the Office of Administration, Bureau of Affirmative Action, and the Human Relations Commission for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with the provisions of the Contract Compliance Regulations, pursuant to 16 Pa. Code §49.35 (relating to information concerning compliance by contractors). If CONTRACTOR does not possess documents or records reflecting the necessary information requested, it shall furnish such information on reporting forms supplied by the contracting agency, the Bureau of Affirmative Action or the Commission.

8) CONTRACTOR shall actively recruit minority subcontractors or subcontractors with substantial minority representation among their employees.

9) CONTRACTOR shall include the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause in every subcontract, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor.

10) The terms used in this nondiscrimination clause shall have the same meaning as in the Contract Compliance Regulations issued by the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission, 16 Pa. Code Chapter 49.

11) CONTRACTOR's obligations under this clause are limited to CONTRACTOR's facilities within Pennsylvania, or where the contract is for purchase of goods manufactured outside of Pennsylvania, the facilities at which such goods are actually produced.

ATTACHMENT C
CONTRACTOR INTEGRITY

A. Definitions:

1) "**Confidential information**" means information that is not public knowledge, or available to the public on request, disclosure of which would give an unfair, unethical, or illegal advantage to another desiring to contract with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or the County of Westmoreland.

2) "**Consent**" means written permission signed by a duly authorized officer or employee of the Commonwealth or the County, provided that where the material facts have been disclosed, in writing, by prequalification, bid, proposal, or contractual terms, the County shall be deemed to have consented by virtue of execution of this agreement.

3) "**Contractor**" means the individual or entity that has entered into this agreement with the County, including directors, officers, partners, managers, key employees, and owners of more than a 5% interest.

4) "**Financial Interest**" means:

a) Ownership of more than 5% interest in any business; or

b) Holding a position as an officer, director, trustee, partner, employee, or the like, or holding any position of management.

5) "**Gratuity**" means any payment of more than nominal monetary value in the form of cash, travel, entertainment, gifts, meals, lodging, loans, subscriptions, advances, deposits of money, services, employment, or contracts of any kind.

B. The Contractor shall maintain the highest standards of integrity in the performance of this agreement and shall take no action in violation of State or Federal laws, regulations, or other requirements that govern contracting with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and/or the County.

C. The Contractor shall not disclose to others any confidential information gained by virtue of this agreement.

D. The Contractor shall not, in connection with this or any other agreement with the County or the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, directly or indirectly, offer, confer, or agree to confer any pecuniary benefit on anyone as consideration for the decision, opinion, recommendation, vote, other exercise of discretion, or violation of a known legal duty by any officer or employee of the County or the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

E. The Contractor, shall not, in connection with this or any other agreement with the County or the Commonwealth, directly or indirectly, offer, give, or agree or promise to give to anyone any gratuity for the benefit of or at the direction or request of any officer or employee of the County or the Commonwealth.

F. Except with the consent of the County and the Commonwealth, neither the Contractor nor anyone in privity with the Contractor shall accept or agree to accept from, or give or agree to give to, any person, any gratuity from any person in connection with the performance of work under this agreement except as provided therein.

G. Except with the consent of the County and the Commonwealth, the Contractor shall not have a financial interest in any other contractor, subcontractor, or supplier providing services, labor, or material on this project.

H. The Contractor, upon being informed that any violation of these provisions has occurred or may occur, shall immediately notify the County in writing.

I. The Contractor, by execution of this agreement and by the submission of any bills or invoices for payment pursuant thereto, certifies and represents that the Contractor has not violated any of these provisions.

J. The Contractor shall, upon request of the Office of State Inspector General or County Controller, reasonably and promptly make available to that office and its representatives, for inspection and copying, all business and financial records of the Contractor of, concerning, and referring to this agreement with the County or which are otherwise relevant to the enforcement of these provisions.

K. For violation of any of the above provisions, the County (or Commonwealth, if applicable) may terminate this and any other agreement with the Contractor, claim liquidated damages in an amount equal to the value of anything received in breach of these provisions, claim damages for all expenses incurred in obtaining another contractor to complete performance hereunder, and debar and suspend the Contractor from doing business with the County or Commonwealth. These rights and remedies are cumulative, and the use or nonuse of any one shall not preclude the use of all or any other. These rights and remedies are in addition to those the Commonwealth or the County may have under the law, statute, regulation, or otherwise.
